A child may not be subjected to unusual or extreme methods of discipline which may cause psychological or physical harm to the child.

A child has the right to clean, seasonal clothing that is age and gender appropriate.

A child may not be deprived of specific or civil rights.

A child has the right to confidentiality of information.

A child has the right to privacy.

A child has the right to freedom from humiliation, neglect, or financial or other exploitation.

A child has the right to be free from sexual abuse and sexual harassment and to be free from retaliation for reporting such incidents, and regarding agency policies and procedures for responding to such incidents. Our schools have a zero-tolerance policy regarding sexual abuse, assault and harassment.

A child has the right to access to information pertinent to making a decision in sufficient time to facilitate their decision.

A child has the right to informed consent or refusal or expression of choice and withdrawal of consent regarding: service delivery, release of information, concurrent services, composition of the service delivery team and involvement in research.

A child has the right to access or referral to legal entities for appropriate representation.

A child has the right to access self-help and advocacy support services.

A child has the right to adherence to research guidelines and ethics when involved in research.

A child has the right to investigation and resolution of alleged infringement of rights.
